

Spiders in Space: Researchers Observe Arachnid Habits in a Microgravity Environment

— The very idea of spiders in space brings to mind campy, black and white horror films involving eight-legged monsters. In actuality, it is a scientific investigation called Commercial Generic Bioprocessing Apparatus Science Insert-05 or CSI-05, in which researchers observe arachnid habits in a microgravity environment. This is the second spider investigation on the International Space Station -- the first was CSI-03 -and researchers have high hopes that the sequel will eclipse the original:

Scheduled to launch with STS-134, the spider habitat will transfer from the space shuttle Endeavour to the space station. Once aboard, the crew will place the two habitats into the Commercial Generic Bioprocessing Apparatus or CGBA. This equipment will maintain a consistent temperature, humidity and lighting cycle for the spiders and their sustenance supply of fruit flies. The CGBA also controls imaging for the investigation.

The spider pair currently planned for investigation with CSI-05 are both golden orb spiders (Nephila clavipes), which spin a three dimensional, asymmetric web. This is different from the two orb spiders (Larinioides patagiatus and Metepeira) that launched to the space station on STS-126, which were selected specifically for the symmetry of their web formation. Scientists are looking to see if and how the arachnids will spin their webs differently in microgravity. The results will help them to understand the behavioral role of gravity for the spiders and their fruit fly companions.

"I think people can relate to everyday insects and they can understand why the experiment is of interest," said Stefanie Countryman, coordinator for CSI-05. "Plus, the visual aspects of this experiment make it very appealing to the general public."

When a sequel does top the original, in science as in movies, it usually has something to do with lessons learned during the first production. The CSI-03 investigation, for instance, was unfortunately restricted to eight days, due to the spiders' fruit flies food 'sliming' the observation window. This obscured the view inside the habitat and limited the study. For CSI-05, which is funded by the National Space Biomedical Research Institute or NSBRI and the NASA National Lab Education Office, the fruit flies will have a separate compartment from the spiders. The crew will slowly introduce the flies -approximately every four days -- into the two individual spider habitats, which should allow for clear imagery through the viewing window for the full 45-day duration of the investigation. The fruit flies are not, however, simply nourishment for the spiders. They are actually a secondary study themselves. Scientists plan to look at their

mobility over time to see if and how they react to the microgravity environment. They should be able to observe growth, behavioral and flight patterns as the flies develop.

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There also is an important education element to this investigation, sponsored by Baylor College of Medicine Center for Educational Outreach and Orion's Quest. While the N. clavipes is spinning in space, students on Earth will develop and observe their own spider habitats. Teachers can use a curriculum found on <u>bioedonline.org</u>. This Web site includes daily images sent from the space station to the BioServe Payload Operations and Control Center. This allows students to compare their spiders' spinning habits to those of the spiders in microgravity in near real time. Orion's Quest Web site -- <u>orionsquest.org</u> -will focus on the habits of the fruit flies in space.

With some 40 years of study and involvement in finance, my only desire is to help others get into the game. Investment can be daunting. Everybody needs a friend who will tell the truth. For those who have wondered, I do not hold an SEC 6 or 7 license. I invest only for myself and for the various Investment Clubs I direct. They are closed organizations and new members must be referred by current partners and match existing investments. If members here would like to establish an Investment Club, I would be happy to do that. But, that is not my purpose, here. My blog is for general education and your questions are welcome. I would actually prefer that you become self-sufficient in your financial planning and would be honored if my missives assisted you in that venture.

Portfolio Plays

Technically, Head and Shoulders isn't shampoo but, you could take a bath.

You'll hear the various pundits saying their books refer to ;technicals; or ;fundamentals; and may be wondering what that gibberish really means. How fortunate for you I anticipated your wonderment and am providing the answers right here.

<u>Technical Analysis</u> is the domain of the Chartists or those who suggest that the future of an investment may be forecast by patterns found in past and recent trends. While some would argue in favor of <u>Fundamental Analysis</u> (a review of the financials of any given company) the prognosticators of the technical type do have some credence.


There are several patterns that seem to work with a great deal of certainty, and one of them is developing right now; the <u>Head and Shoulders</u>.

Take a look at the chart below showing the performance of this past year:



I overlaid the three major indices; The S&P 500, the DOW 30 and the NASDAQ and you can see that they have an eerie way of moving at the same rate in both directions. Further, as you look at the left side of the chart you'll notice that the trend was generally upward until a point of <u>resistance</u> was hit at about +11 to 12% above last year's level. The markets then moved downward to a point of <u>support</u> at about +3 to 5% and began <u>trending</u> positive, again. That forms the Left Shoulder with the Neckline established at the low point.

From that level the move was up to a high point of +16 to 23% which became the new level of resistance and the markets trended down to the Neckline of +3 to 5% forming the Head. Next, the move was up until a <u>correction</u> back to a level that was flat to up 3% and again pushed to the levels of the Left Shoulder, dropping again to test the support level of the Neckline and back up through resistance before taking a turn back down forming the Right Shoulder at +11 to 15%. My forecast from this type of formation is that the new downward pressure will cause a correction back through the Neckline and further down another leg as deep as the Head was high. This equates to a new market bottom, or new level of support at about 890 for the S&P 500 by the end of Q2 2011. In the short run, I see a drop of about 10 to 12% in the next month. Here is another chart of the S&P 500 showing the performance over the past two years:



The prediction brings us back to the level of <u>consolidation</u> reached in Q2 2009 where the 50 day and 200 day moving averages crossed before the trend accelerated to the upside.

I've been working these numbers since I saw the formation of the Head and had hoped the Right Shoulder would not consolidate when there was a bounce off the Neckline. I became scared when the trend topped in August, then cheered that I may be wrong when the markets ran beyond the 200-day Moving Average in September, but that doesn't look like it will hold.

Don Luskin of Trend Macro is even comparing the trend with the impending tax increases and runaway government spending to the doomsday scenario of August 1937 when FDR attempted to balance the budget by raising taxes causing the depression within The Great Depression. Luskin and Charles Nenner say the downside will be even lower than my target and may drop below the market bottom formed in March of 2009.

With a <u>falling dollar</u> and rising commodity prices that increase input costs to all consumer goods, <u>actual unemployed (U6)</u> at over 26 Million in an economy that is 67 to 72% consumer dependant, more than 20% of mortgaged homes underwater, a shadow inventory of bank-owned properties exceeding 2 years supply in addition to the 1 year supply already on the market and corporate revenues falling making further cost cuts the only way to maintain margins, the outlook seems bleak. But, read the previous articles again and stay tuned. I'm going to show you how to preserve your capital and even achieve a return on your money in a falling market. After all, we're smarter than the rest of the herd!


